

What are the Benefits of Association with DPI?

- Global recognition
- Involvement in advocacy efforts to help monitor and implement international agreements
- Receive 6 grounds passes for UN Headquarters in New York
- Priority Registration for UN DPI/NGO Conference and ability to sponsor workshops and shape the Conference
- Access to thematic NGO Briefings and ability to propose and lead "NGO-led briefing at UN HQ
- Access to UN materials, activities and events, as well as the NGO Resource Centre at the UNHQ in New York
- Networking with other NGOs, Member State Delegates

Annual DPI/NGO Relations Information Programme

- About 30 weekly NGO Briefings per year (Thursdays 11:00 am 12:30 pm)
- 2 Communications Workshops
- 2-day Orientation Programme for representatives of Associated NGOs
- 1-day Orientation Programme NGO Youth representatives
- 3-day UN DPI/NGO Conference



How to Apply for Association

- Online Application
- Constitution or By-laws
- Proof of non-profit/tax exempt status
- Most recent financial statement (preferably in U.S. dollars). Requirements depend on annual income of organisation
- 6 samples of organization's most recent information materials / activities related to the work of the UN (newsletters, reports, audio or video productions, blogs, events...)
- Three recommendation letters from an individual or organization
- Helpful: One recommendation letter from a UN entity or a government office with which your NGO has partnered, or a DPI / ECOSOC NGO

DPI-Associated NGOs are Expected to...

- Raise awareness about key UN issues
- Disseminate UN information products
- Design and implement public information activities and programmes on UN issues
- Collaborate with UN Information Centres or Services, or other UN entities
- Abide by the rules and regulations that govern the use of the UN emblem, name, flag as well as the use of the UN grounds passes
- Submit Annual Review





Recent Conference Themes












